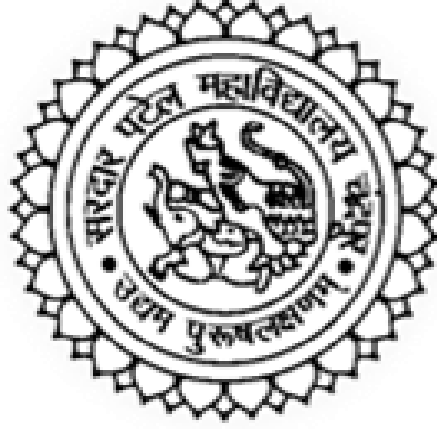

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

College is affiliated to Gondwana University, Gadchiroli and does not have a freedom to set up curriculum. However many staff members of college are member, chairman of BOS in various subject and Dean of faculties are actively involved in framing the syllabus.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- *Semester pattern is followed for all UG and PG courses.
- *Teachers prepared annual and semester wise teaching plan as per time table and try to complete portion assigned to them in stipulated time.
- *Regular attendance of students is recorded and daily teaching report is also maintained in a diary.
- *Teachers uses course material, teaching aids, projector and various ICT tools to make teaching –learning process interactive.

Winter and Summer examinations of odd semester and even semester are conducted by Gondwana University, Gadchiroli. As per University pattern, for all courses internal marks are prescribed. Internal assessment is carried out through attendance in classroom, Assignment work and Unit test on specific portion of syllabus. Due to time constrain, practice of conducting model examination is abandon. However, model question papers are issued to students as per university pattern. Students are found to be benefitted through this practice.

Best Practice Adopted by Research and Publication Committee of College

1. Title of the Practice :

- Electronic publication of SPM Students Research Magazine.

2. Goal :

- The aim of the practice is to provide platform for post Graduate students & research student of the institute for publication of their research work carried out during course. The institute not only provide platform to the student but also concern for the environmental conservation by publishing this journal electronically. No paper is being used during the publication of the journal

3. The Context

- The challenging issue that had to be addressed while designing and implementing of the practice is making students prepared for writing a research paper. Students were motivated to publish the work they carry out during PG. They were directed to visit library and refer various journals available there both in print and electronic format. Guidance from concern faculty member is also provided to overcome this challenging issue.

4. The Practice (Only for students)

- Post graduate students of the institute who are working under the supervision of the faculty member towards their dissertation are being encouraged to publish their work. Through a circular online research papers are invited from Departments in standard guidelines prepared for the journal. Students are given sufficient time for preparation of manuscript. After that, the students forward this manuscript to the editor of the journal by an email. The editors acknowledge the manuscript and segregate them into English, Hindi and Marathi languages. Further, the editor goes through each manuscript and clerk for any significant mistake in it. Afterwards these checked manuscript forwarded to a publisher in Nagpur through an email. The publisher converts the respective manuscript which received in word format in to a PDF format. All the manuscript are combined together and DTP work is carried out.

Finally the journal is prepared with all the necessary information in it in a CD form. These CD's were distributed to those students and faculty member who contributes to the journal. The journal which is having a ISSN number is also uploaded on college website for public access.

- The uniqueness about the practice in the Indian higher education is this platform is only for PG students and research scholars of the institute which can contribute their research work at initial level so as to understated the science and arts of writing a research paper so as to develop a habit in future.

5. Evidence of Success

- Since the inception of the journal a positive attitude is observed amongst students for it. Every year students are eager to submit their work in this journal. It has been found that number of research papers are increasing year by year. The results of the activity indicate that the awareness amongst the student for the writing of research paper has increased. The student also encourage their friends to contribute in it.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

- No significant problems were encountered while publication of the e-journal. However some technical difficulties were faced by the publisher while converting word files into PDF files. In terms of resource required associate editor of the journal along with one assistant had single handedly executed all the work related to this activity in the institute. At publisher side, the had carried out all the work. So about five individuals had contributed for the success of the e-journal. In terms of money for the publication of the journal, for converting the word frills to PDF format, DTP and making 100 CD with printed cover (hand cover) cost about Rs,21,000/- which is less than print version of the journal for previous years.

1. Title of the Practice :

Detection & counselling of sickle cell Anaemia

2. Goal :

As this area in Maharashtra is famous for the sickle cell patients, the aim of the practice is to find out the student from the institution & in turn from the area who are suffering from sickle cell anemia. The aim of institution is not only to find out the sickle cell patients but also to aware them by counseling regarding cause of disease.

3. The Context :-

The facts regarding to conduct this practice in the institution is that the large no. of students are admitted in the institution are from urban as well as nearby rural area & most of the people in Chandrapur & Gadchiroli district is suffering from this disease. Since this is tribal region & the people are unaware of this disease, the practices of such awareness programme would be very helpful to the people of the area & for the betterment of society.

4. The Practice :-

All the students of the institute were informed regarding the practice which was carried out in the institution on the date 9th of March 2015. This practice was organized in collaboration with Indira Gandhi Government Medical College, Nagpur. The inaugural programme was taken for this practice. Dr. Ankita Saimon & Dr. Shrikant Ganveer were present for the programme as a chief guest as well as under their supervision the prescreening test was carried out whole day. Dr. Ankita Saimon informed the students in her speech about the reasons & the symptoms of the sickle cell. She also elaborated about the facilities provided by Government of such sickle cell patients. The Guest faculty also insisted the students to spread the information whatever they gained that day & informed their

friends, family member & neighbors about the sickle cell disease. Following inaugural programme, counseling & prescreening test was done. Students were underwent very enthusiastically through this the test. Nearly 5ml blood was taken from each students & test immediately for sickle cell. Total of 98 students were tested for the sickle cell. Of the 98 students 6 were found to be sickle cell +ve. These 6 students were informed further electrophoretic diagnosis & was called them to Nagpur. The counseling of sickle cell +ve students was done by the doctors.

5. Evidence of Success :-

Since the information sought from the IGGMC, Nagpur & from Joint Director, Higher Education, Nagpur, the institute & Zoology Dept. came into force to organize the practice in the institute. When the date for sickle cell test in the institute was declared, the students visited to zoology department daily to know about the disease, the test & regarding all aspects of the disease. The students were found to be very alert & showed their zest & positive attitude about the test. When the actual test was carried out all the students were tested themselves in discipline. This indicated the alertness of the students & their enthusiasm as well. Students asked their queries to doctors & got satisfied by the information. There was total 98 students participated in this prescreening sickle cell test. The result of this practice indicated that the 5% to 6% students were found to be +ve for this inherited disease & since these students were counseled they became aware of their future life.

6. Problems encountered & Resources required :-

- No significant problem was encountered as the practice was carried out in collaboration with other agencies. The government & NGOs agencies were ready to conduct such practices in the institution. But their services could not be regularly available. So if this practice required going continuously it require a technician to take the blood from the students to send to test in hospitals, disposable syringe with needle & fund as well to execute all the work related to this practice.
